#### **ORGANISATION:**

The Bunbury Stamp, Coin and Banknote Show 2019 is a National One Frame Exhibition organised by the Western Australian Philatelic Council under the auspices of the Australian Philatelic Federation Ltd (APF).

#### **REGULATIONS:**

These regulations are based on the APF Regulations for Australian Philatelic Exhibitions.

#### **CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION:**

Participation in the Exhibition is open to all exhibitors resident in Australia whether they are members of affiliated organisations or not. The exhibitor must be the bona-fide owner of the exhibit. Exhibits cannot be entered in joint names. Each entry must be entered in the correct class. Non-competitive entries will be by invitation of the Committee only.

The entrant shall provide a description for the catalogue comprising not less than 20 and not more than 50 words when submitting their entry. The Committee reserves the right to alter any description for the catalogue. The exhibitor must also provide a draft of the title page of the exhibit to the Organising Committee no later than 1st April 2019 as these will be required by the judges well before the exhibition.

The Committee reserves the right to limit or reject entries at its sole discretion. Exhibitors will be advised of the acceptance or otherwise of their exhibits by email by 15th April 2019.

Youth entries will be judged in three age groups: 10 to 15 years old, 16 to 18 years old and 19 to 21 years old. The age of youth exhibitors is that attained at 1 January 2019.

### **APPLICATIONS:**

- Applications from exhibitors will only be accepted on the official entry form and within the appointed time. Photocopies of the entry form are acceptable.
- A draft of the title page or synopsis of the exhibit **MUST** accompany each entry form.
- All entries must be forwarded to the Exhibition Secretary Bunbury 2019, Western Australian Philatelic Council, PO Box 886 Subiaco, Western Australia 6904, or emailed to [stafford@southwest.com.au](mailto:stafford@southwest.com.au)
- The closing date for entries is Monday 1st April 2019.
- All philatelic exhibits must be mounted on white or light coloured sheets.
- With the exception of Coin exhibits, each exhibit page must be within the range of 21cm to 24cm width and a **MAXIMUM** of 28.5cm in height including the protector. Sheets double the maximum width may be used but must fit within the 15-sheet frame layout so that they sit completely within one row and do not span two rows – see diagram below for row and sheet layout used in frames. Double-width sheets count as two sheets and their position in the frame must be clearly indicated on the back of the sheet (eg "This sheet = sheets 6&7").
- Each Coin exhibit will be displayed in a lockable glass-topped metal case provided by the Exhibition Organising Committee.
- Each Coin exhibit is to be in landscape format and must fit within the internal dimensions of one case: 85 cm x 55 cm x 6 cm height.
- Sheets for each exhibit must bear the name and address of the exhibitor on the reverse of each sheet and be numbered consecutively in the order that they are to be mounted.
- The frames used for this exhibition will be 1200mm wide x 900mm high and hold 15 standard size sheets arranged in three rows of five as per below diagram.

**ENTRY FEES:**

The frame fee of \$45 per frame (or display case) and return postage (where applicable) must accompany the entry form.

**DELIVERY OF EXHIBITS:**

After paying the entry fee and being notified of acceptance of their exhibit(s), the exhibitor will receive an envelope for each frame of 15 sheets and notification of frames allocated. Each exhibit sheet should be placed in a lightweight transparent sheet protector, with one side open. The transparent protector dimensions must not exceed the exhibition sheet dimensions by more than 1cm all round. Sheets received without protectors will not be accepted. Certificates of expertisation (where applicable) shall be placed on the reverse of the relevant sheet inside the sheet protector.

- **By hand: Between 10:00 am – 12:00 noon Friday 19th July 2019 to the Bin Room**
- **By post: No earlier than 5th July 2019 (2 weeks before) and No later than 12th July 2019 (one week before).**

**PLAN OF THE EXHIBIT:**

All exhibits should have an introductory page or plan to indicate what is being shown and give guidance to the viewer, including areas of special interest.

**SECURITY AND INSURANCE:**

The Organisers will take all reasonable care of the exhibits with which it has been entrusted. However, it declines all responsibility in case of loss, theft or damage during conveyance to/from the Exhibition or at the Exhibition. Exhibitors are advised to arrange adequate insurance for their exhibits.

**MOUNTING OF EXHIBITS:**

Upon receiving the exhibit, the Organising Committee will issue a receipt, which must be produced after the Exhibition to enable return of the exhibit. All exhibits will be mounted and removed from the frames in accordance with instructions given by the person in charge of the Bin Room. Personal mounting and removal can only be done with the express permission of the person in charge of the bin room and according to his/her directions.

Entrants with Coin exhibits will be allocated a set time to mount their display/s in the case/s. If the entrant is unable to attend to mount their display/s, they must provide one or more clear diagrams to enable their exhibit to be mounted by a person appointed by the person in charge of the Bin Room.

For the duration of the Exhibition, no exhibit may be either modified or withdrawn. No exhibit will be released after the exhibition until all exhibits have been removed from the frames and subsequently checked by the person in charge of the Bin Room.

**EXCLUSIONS:**

The Jury shall penalise exhibits containing forgeries or reproductions not so described. Exhibitors are reminded that the rules of the APF stipulate that once the Organising Committee accepts an application form, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to produce the exhibit. Failure to give notice or produce the entry is subject to penalty by the APF and in either case the entry fees will not be returned.

**AWARDS:**

The Organising Committee will place for disposal by the Jury a number of Special Awards and medals according to the points achieved:

55-59 Bronze	60-64 Silver Bronze	65-69 Silver	70-74 Large Silver
75-79 Vermeil	80-84 Large Vermeil	85-89 Gold	90-100 Large Gold.

**RECOGNITION OF EXHIBITION REGULATIONS:**

By signing the application form, the exhibitor is bound by these Regulations for the Bunbury Stamp, Coin & Banknote Show 2019.

**AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS:**

The Western Australian Philatelic Council reserves the right, subject to approval of the APF, to amend these Regulations.

**JURY & JUDGING CRITERIA:****Jury:**

The members of the Jury will be approved by the APF. The decisions of the Jury are final and cannot be contested. Judging will be done at the frames / cases and carried out in accordance with the FIP Special Regulations for Evaluation of Competitive Exhibits. A judge's critique of exhibits will be held for interested participants including a brief discussion in front of the frames (time permitting).

**Criteria:**

For philatelic exhibits, the judging criteria that will be used by the Jury will be those of the APF.

For numismatic exhibits, the judging criteria that will be used by the Jury will be those set for numismatic entries in the Mandurah 2010 and Mandurah 2016 Exhibitions (see [www.peelnumis.org](http://www.peelnumis.org) for details).
